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Our office is within the historic Bletchley Park codebreakers museum site. The entrance is off Sherwood Drive, opposite Bletchley railway station.

By road:

From the M1 junction 14 (from the north) or junction 13 (from the south) follow the brown tourist signs to Bletchley Park. **Satnavs may lead to an old entrance which is no longer in use; if this happens please enter "MK3 6DS" and try again.**

By rail:

Direct train from London Euston to Bletchley (45-60 minutes) plus a 5-minute walk (turn right out of Bletchley station and cross the road at the pelican crossing). Alternatively a direct train from London Euston to Milton Keynes Central (30-40 minutes) plus a £10 taxi ride.

At the Bletchley Park gatehouse:

Say that you've come to see Cutland Consulting in the Mansion; you will be given a visitor's swipe card. (If the gatehouse staff claim not to have heard of us, try 'Eco Design Consultants', who are the people with whom we share our office). Park where directed then use your swipe card at the pedestrian gate in the corner of the car park near a green wooden hut. The path leads past a grass tennis court to the Mansion, the large red-brick 1920s house pictured below.

At the Mansion:

Walk into the main entrance and go up the stairs at the far end of the hallway, ignoring the sign that says 'Area closed'. At the landing double back to the right, go up more stairs, and look for Room 3 (sometimes known as Room 1 – there is some debate about the heritage!)
